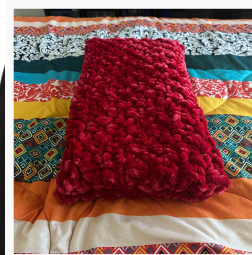
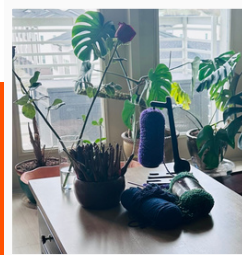
Born in Plano, Texas, Constance spent nearly a decade in Virginia before returning to Texas, where her family has continued to reestablish its roots.

BAKED ZITI

Ingredients (serves 6):

- 1 lb ziti or penne pasta
- 1 lb ground beef or Italian sausage
- 1 jar (24 oz) marinara sauce
- 1 tsp Italian seasoning
- 2 cups shredded mozzarella cheese
- ½ cup grated Parmesan cheese

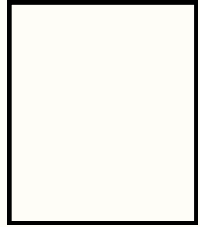
Instructions:

1. Preheat oven to 375°F. Cook pasta according to package directions and drain.
2. Brown ground beef or sausage in a skillet. Drain excess grease.
3. Stir in marinara sauce and Italian seasoning. Simmer 5 minutes.
4. Combine pasta and meat sauce. Pour into a baking dish.
5. Top with mozzarella and Parmesan.
6. Bake 20 minutes until cheese is melted and bubbly.
